A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF HURRICANE, UTAH, AMENDING FEES RELATED TO CONNECTION OF MUNICIPAL POWER AND/OR WATER SERVICES.

WHEREAS the Hurricane City Council is authorized by Section 10-3-717 of the Utah Code and Section 1-5-6 G.1. of the Hurricane City Code to establish fees for municipal services; and

WHEREAS said City Council has previously adopted fees related to the connection of municipal power services and desires to clarify and/or amend these fees; and

WHEREAS the City Council desires to clarify that these fees are related to the connection of municipal power and/or water services; and

WHEREAS the Hurricane City Council finds that it is necessary and desirable for the preservation and protection of the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of Hurricane,

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the City Council that the following fee schedule is hereby approved and adopted for implementation as part of Section 8-1-4 and Section 8-4-4 of the Hurricane City Code:

Dear Mayor Billings:

The Washington County Water Conservancy District Board of Trustees intends to increase the fee for purchasing wholesale water from the current rate of \$1.44 per 1,000 gallons to the proposed rate of \$1.54 per 1,000 gallons (a \$0.10 increase per 1,000 gallons), effective July 1, 2022.

The Washington County Water Conservancy District Board of Trustees also intends to increase the fee for purchasing secondary water from the current rate of \$0.90 per 1,000 gallons to the proposed rate of \$1.00 per 1,000 gallons (a \$0.10 increase per 1,000 gallons), effective July 1, 2022.

Public hearings will be held on **Tuesday, June 7, 2022, at 6:00 p.m.** at the Office of the Washington County Water Conservancy District, located at 533 E. Waterworks Drive, St. George, Utah, 84770 (which, as required by law, must be at least seven days after this notice is made). The purpose of the hearings is to receive comments regarding the proposed increase of the fees and to explain the reasons for the proposed increase.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF HURRICANE, UTAH, APPROVING AN INCREASE IN BILLING RATES FOR WATER USAGE IN THE CITY OF HURRICANE.

WHEREAS the Washington County Water Conservancy District has imposed an annual rate increase on the cost of wholesale water in the amount of \$.10 per thousand gallons; and

WHEREAS the Hurricane City Water Board has recommended an increase in Hurricane City billing rates for usage of water to pay for costs of water development and to stabilize revenue for the Hurricane City Water Department; and

WHEREAS the Hurricane City Council finds that it is necessary and desirable for the preservation and protection of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of Hurricane,

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the City Council of Hurricane, Utah as follows:

1. At such time that the Washington County Water Conservancy District imposes its annual increase of \$.10 per thousand gallons for the cost of wholesale water, the Hurricane City water rates shall also be increased by the following amounts:

a. an increase of \$.10 per thousand gallons to pay for development by the City of Hurricane of existing and new sources of water, subject to review by Hurricane City Water Board and approval by Hurricane City Council in not less than 5 years from the date hereof.

b. a 2% increase in Hurricane City general base rate and per-thousand-gallon rate to stabilize revenue for the Hurricane City Water Department, subject to annual review by the Hurricane City Water Board and approval by the Hurricane City Council.

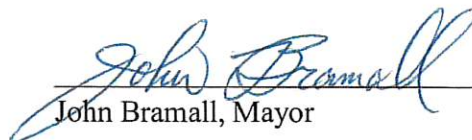
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall take effect at the earliest date allowed by law.

Comparison charges for fire hydrant construction water per 1000 gallons

Hurricane city	\$1.75
Laverkin city	\$3.00
Toquerville city	\$6.00 up to 10,000 gallons, above 20,000 gallons \$12.00
Ivins city	\$3.50
Springdale	\$12.04
Washington	\$2.51
Santa Clara	\$2.50
St George	\$2.16
WCWCD	\$2.35

If we don't count the Toquerville above 20,000-gallon \$12.00 Charge, and the Springdale \$12.04 charge the average is \$2.97 per thousand for construction water. Please think about it for our water board discussion. I would like a recommendation from water board for the future of our construction water rate.
